Starting with these presumptions, "Rendezvous In Majorca" weaves an exceedingly tantalizing tale of deceit and intrigue. The novel makes a right mix of the Ian Feldman's extensive knowledge of historical evidence and military tactics in order to create a suspenseful thriller. The Russian KGB, British MI5, and the American CIA unearth a chilling secret that dates back to the Second World War. To contain this secret, they are not only willing to let innocents be punished but also take part in criminal activities.

This novel is about Trixey Haygood and her heroic lover, who is an ex-Nazi spy who together have to rush against time in a bid to save the world and prevent a crisis that soon threatens to escalate into the Third World War. Ignoring the threat to their very existence the feisty twosome struggle to unravel the intricate web of deception and hypocrisy. An alarming Cold War-era novel that is replete with high-speed chases, awe-inspiring weapons, and shady political deals, the novel is worth being made into a movie. Feldman's semi-historical spy thriller is made interesting by its reliance on facts. This makes its premises thrilling and the conclusions that it draws much more terrifying.
